4. Dora was not a lawyer, and Dollie was older than Dora.
5. The teacher was younger than the doctor, but the baker was older than the doctor.
6. McTavish had been a carpenter after he had been a horse trainer, and he had been a butcher after he had been a carpenter.
7. Donna did not study McTavish's life in his 40s or 50s, and Dan discovered McTavish had been a butcher when he was the same age that Dan is now.
